The U.S. Healthy People 2030 goal is to protect 80% of teens with the HPV cancer prevention vaccine, but only 56.7% of children are up to date per 2023 data. The American Cancer Society (ACS) invites community health centers, pediatric practices, and family practice medical groups to join a no-cost program to close adolescent vaccination care gaps and improve clincal processes. Together, we can help prevent over 37,000 cancers a year.


