San Bernardino County has an MMR vaccination rate of 93.7% for kindergarteners, which is below the state average of 96.1%, with some schools as low as 14.6%. Clinicians should prioritize vaccinations to achieve herd immunity and establish airborne precautions for patients showing measles symptoms to prevent exposure.

MMR Vaccination Recommendations

Routine Vaccination:	• Should have 1 or 2 doses unless
$\circ$ 1st dose: 12–15 months	there's presumptive immunity
• 2nd dose: 4–6 years (can be given 28 days after 1st dose)	(e.g., documented vaccinations
Vaccine Options:	or past infection).
• MMR or MMRV (measles/mumps/rubella/varicella)	• No need for routine screening in
• Separate MMR and varicella recommended for ages	non-outbreak areas.
12–47 months	No catch-up second dose recommended
MMRV 2nd Dose:	for adults born before 1989.
• At least 3 months after 1st dose, allowed up to 12 years	
Travel Recommendations:	
<ul> <li>Vaccinate 2-3 weeks before travel</li> </ul>	
• Infants 6-11 months: 1 early MMR dose (not part of	
routine series)	
• Children 12 months+: complete 2-dose series (4	
weeks apart)	

Measles testing should involve nasopharyngeal swabs and urine specimens, and suspected cases must be reported to the San Bernardino County Department of Public Health.
