Subject: California Department of Public Health TB Screening Recommendations

In collaboration with the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) Medi-Cal Program, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Tuberculosis Control Branch offers guidance on tuberculosis (TB) screening.

Despite being preventable, TB remains a significant health issue, particularly affecting Medi-Cal enrollees with an infection rate of 68%, and marginalized communities.

To reduce TB disease, CDPH recommends:

- 1. Screen all patients for TB risk factors using the California TB Risk Assessment.
- 2. **Test** for TB infection if risks are identified, preferably with an IGRA.
- 3. Ensure patients do not have active TB disease through symptom screening and chest x-ray before treating latent TB infection (LTBI).
- 4. **Treat LTBI** with rifamycin-based therapies for 3-4 months.

You are essential in identifying at-risk patients. Assembly Bill 2132 mandates TB screening for adult primary care patients with risk factors. For individuals who test positive for latent TB, follow-up or referral for treatment is necessary. Note that those not eligible for full Medi-Cal coverage may still receive outpatient TB services at no cost under aid code 7H through the Medi-Cal Tuberculosis Program.
