**Subject:** Best Practices for Care of Older Adults (COA) – Functional Status

**Assessment & Medication Review Measure** 

Inland Empire Health Plan (IEHP) would like to take this opportunity to remind providers that the **Care of Older Adults** (**COA**) measure includes two critical components: **Medication Review** (**MR**) and **Functional Status Assessment** (**FSA**). Please find below a summary of the measure requirements, common gaps identified and recommended best practices.

## **Functional Status Assessment (FSA):**

**Requirement:** A complete FSA must document assessment of at least <u>five</u> Activities of Daily Living (ADLs) or <u>four</u> Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs)

## **Missed Opportunity Identified:**

• The FSA is being performed but not properly coded, resulting in missed measure capture.

#### **Medication Review (MR):**

**Requirement:** A valid Medication Review includes at least one medication review <u>and</u> the presence of a medication list in the medical record. Both must occur **during the same visit** where the provider type is a prescribing practitioner or clinical pharmacist.

### **Missed Opportunities Identified:**

- Medication reviews are conducted but **not coded**.
- **Annual Wellness Visits** were completed without MR coding, despite MR being a required element.
- Only **one of the two required codes** (medication list and review) are submitted.

#### **Best Practices for Providers:**

- Review your COA roster in the IEHP Direct Stars Incentive Program 2025 report available on the IEHP portal to identify patients missing FSA or MR documentation.
- Audit encounter history to confirm if services were provided but not coded.
- If both the medication review and the medication list are present for the same visit, **ensure both** codes are submitted.
- Submit corrected claims to capture previously completed but uncoded services.
- Moving forward, ensure visits that include FSA and MR assessments are documented in the member's medical record and appropriately coded when the services have been provided.
