Population Health Faculty & Residency Curriculum Training

The **Population Health Residency Training** Program is a grant-funded initiative by the Riverside County Medical Association (RCMA) and Inland Empire Foundation for Medical Care (IEFMC) designed for **Family Practice, Internal Medicine or Pediatric residency programs in the Inland Empire**. This program is offered at no cost to your Residency Program.

Two Primary Care Residency Programs will be selected for the 2026-2027 academic year. This curriculum also includes faculty development to provide for future sustainability in your training program after this initial year.

This 10-month curriculum will begin in August 2026 and conclude in May 2027. RCMA/IEFMC will work with the selected training programs to determine the ideal pathway to incorporate this Population Health Training into your individual Residency training program.

The faculty is Barry Bittman, M.D. and Katie Bourbeau-Medinilla, M.D. Dr. Bittman is a neurologist, author, international speaker, researcher and population health innovator who serves as the Chief Population Health and Strategy Officer for IEFMC. Dr. Bourbeau-Medinilla is the Chief Population Health Officer at Arrowhead Regional Medical Center, and a former Population Health Fellow.

- Work-Life Balance and Eliminating Physician/Staff Burnout
